



Corporate Contributions Program Priority Areas

The program is targeted primarily towards supporting the company's community reinvestment activities including:

- Affordable housing development
- Education, self-sufficiency and empowerment services for lower-income families
- Job creation and retention efforts in low-income neighborhoods

Seattle Bank will normally consider one contribution request per year from organizations classified as a 501(c)3 tax-exempt nonprofit, located in our delineated communities of King and Pierce County. It is important that organizations requesting contributions demonstrate a broad base of community support as well as support from other local corporations and foundations.

- The company does not contribute to individuals, churches for religious causes, political campaigns nor does it provide support for start-up funding.
- When an organization seeks to renew a contribution, information will be required on how the company's previous donations were used and the value they provided.
- Special consideration is given to organizations in which a Seattle Financial Group or Seattle Bank executive is actively involved as a board member.

How to Make a Grant Request

Please include the following information in your request:

- Name of organization as filed with the Secretary of State
- Tax identification number
- Written verification of the organization's 501(c)3 status
- Street address of organization
- Contact person name and phone number
- Description/purpose of the organization
- Specific purpose of grant request
- Description of how the requested funding supports the company's priority funding areas
